# Updates

### CAPRIGHTS - Engagement with Community Gatekeepers and Rightholders

The Centre for Advancement and Protection of the Rights of Vulnerable People, recently held an engagement with its partners and stakeholders to review the progress of its "Reclaim Your Future" project. The event provided a platform for community gatekeepers and rightholders to share their thoughts, ideas, and concerns about the project, while identifying areas for improvement. CAPRIGHTS expressed gratitude for the support of its partners and stakeholders, believing that by working together, they can promote the rights of rightholders and empower communities. The organization highlighted the importance of collaboration and partnerships in advocating for the rights of rightholders and creating a better future for all





### The Albino Foundation - Sensitization Workshop

A one-day sensitization workshop was held in Jos, Nigeria, for persons with albinism (PWAs) to understand the 2018 Disability Act and their rights as individuals with disabilities. The workshop was organized by The Albino Foundation in collaboration with Voice and attended by over 50 PWAs who learned about the provisions of the act and how it impacts their daily lives. Legal experts discussed the provisions of the act in detail, and PWAs actively participated in discussions and asked questions. The workshop was a huge success, and the organizers are planning their next event to continue the conversation and provide ongoing support for PWAs.

#### **COSROPIN & Dewdrop - Valentines Celebration with Older Persons**

The Coalition of Societies for the Rights of Older Persons in Nigeria (COSROPIN) and Dewdrop Foundation recently partnered to bring joy to the elderly living in the New Kuchingoro IDP Camp in Abuja. The Valentine's Day celebration involved health talks, exercises, dances, and games aimed at combating depression and putting a smile on their faces. The Chairman of Older Persons in the camp expressed gratitude for the gesture and appealed to others to remember people in IDP camps during the Valentine's Day celebration. In a post-Valentine celebration, COSROPIN and Youngstars FC had a football match. The Head of Administration for Dewdrop Foundation, Vivian Ugwu, promised to continue collaborating with COSROPIN and other stakeholders to improve the lives of the elderly and less privileged in society.





### YIAGA Africa Launches Jungle ahead of 2023 Elections

In the bid to sensitize the youth to participate in the forthcoming elections, YIAGA Africa with support from Voice, created and launched a jingle which served as an innovative approach to meeting its advocacy goals. The has been on airplay and is published on the Voice Naija platform.

### CARE - Visit to FAAN to Discuss Seamless Travel of PWDs.

The Center for Ability, Rehabilitation, and Empowerment (C.A.R.E. Nigeria) recently visited the Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FAAN) and The Skyway Aviation Handling Company (SAHCOL) to discuss challenges faced by persons with disabilities (PWDs) and the need for more synergy to maximize the use of the Ambi Lift, which was funded by the Voice Grant. Both SAHCOL and FAAN restated their commitment to ensuring smooth travels for PWDs in Abuja while commending CARE and OXFAM VOICE IN NIGERIA for their innovative intervention. The stakeholders suggested a few mechanical and electrical modifications to improve the Ambi Lift and acknowledged the satisfactory cooperation among stakeholders with room for improvement.





### 2023 Nigerian Elections update

The 2023 Nigerian presidential elections have been plagued with serious issues and allegations that have undermined the credibility and fairness of the electoral process. The alleged fraudulent compilation of results by the Independent National Electoral Commission (INEC) is one of the most concerning issues, which is a serious infringement on the democratic rights of citizens. However, some polling units have celebrated the ease of access for Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) and older persons during the voting process, which is proof of the advocacy carried out by several Voice grantees. As we await the verdict of the presidential elections, let us continue working towards a just and equitable society.

### FIRC Trains Female Ex-Inmates

In a recent training program, Female Inmates and Returned Citizens Cooperative Society of Nigeria (FIRC) provided ex-inmates from Enugu and Lagos with the skills to produce reusable sanitary pads, with the aim of addressing the challenge of providing female inmates with access to sanitary pads while in custody. The trainees will now go on to train others in their respective custodial centers.



#### **CSAAE - C Advocates Launch**

A group of committed barristers from Southeast Nigeria are working together on a Pro-Bono basis to promote human rights, good governance, and anti-corruption efforts in the region. They meet annually to strategize and express their passion for defending the defenseless and creating a better Southeast Nigeria. CSAAE expressed gratitude to the Chief Judge of Abia State for supporting the release of 35 young people unjustly detained for their involvement in the 2020 ENDSARS protest. The C-Advocates made this happen through their jail deliveries and are making a positive impact on individuals and families.
