Gender Mobile - Celebrating International Women's Day 2023!

Voice Nigeria and grantee organisations have celebrated International Women's Day 2023, with a focus on the theme "DigitAll: Innovation and Technology for Gender." Activities organised by the grantee organisations aim to empower women through technology, promoting gender equality by addressing the digital divide. Gender Mobile Initiative held advocacy programs to promote girls' participation in STEM, documented in Abuja and Ekiti under their "Campus Safety Initiative Project." The collaboration has resulted in remarkable outcomes towards women empowerment through the effective use of technology.





Creating Hope and Change for Nigerian Girls in FCT Slums: NAYA's Economic Empowerment Project.

Creating Hope Among Nigerian Girls through Economic Enterprise (CHANGE) is a project aimed at empowering 16 Adolescent Girls and Young Women (AGYW) in the Federal Capital Territory of Nigeria through vocational training programs in fashion design, hairdressing, and bag making. With the support of Voice to Novel Association for Youth Advocacy (NAYA), the beneficiaries are being mentored by highly skilled Master tradesmen/women to gain hands-on knowledge and practical skills. NAYA's goal is to make the beneficiaries financially resilient, thus sheltering them against gender-based exploitation, abuse, and violence they face. The project will culminate in the establishment of two joint business hubs for 12 beneficiaries who complete the training and mentorship phase. The project is not only changing the lives of the beneficiaries but also the perception of the community, and community leaders promise to stand by NAYA throughout the project.

COSROPIN - Steady Putting Smiles in the Faces of Older Persons in Vulnerable Communities.

The Coalition of Societies for the Rights of Older Persons in Nigeria (COSROPIN) and Save our Heritage Initiative (SOHI) collaborated to host the 3rd "Older Persons' Hangout" sponsored by Voice, which took place on March 18th, 2023. The event was well-attended by 'senior citizens' who had an opportunity to interact and engage in valuable conversations, network, and participate in various recreational activities. The organizers ensured that the older persons' needs were met, and their well-being was prioritized throughout the event. These periodic hangouts for older persons are becoming a norm in the community and provide a platform for them to socialize and form new friendships, which is essential for their emotional, mental and physical health.





Cognito and NINE join Gender Justice Community of Practice to celebrate International Women's Day on Twitter.

In collaboration with the Gender Justice Community of Practice, Cognito and NINE celebrated International Women's Day with a Twitter conversation, highlighting success stories and challenges as regards the gender gap in digital technology. Abuse Knows No Gender: A Project to Educate Boys on Gender-Based Violence.

During the project SABI advocacy visit to secondary schools, one of the mentors, Stephanie Iwunze encountered a young boy in Junior Secondary School, JSS3, who had a warped understanding of gender, believing that being a boy exempted him from abuse or violence. The project SABI is aiming to educate and mentor boys like him to become gender advocates. One initiative is the Boys Against Gender-Based Violence (BAGBV) Club, engaging boys and men in the project's focal states. Connected Development (CODE) engaged with boys to change their mindset, showing that they are capable of understanding gender-based violence and becoming advocates for gender equality. Project SABI is seeking to engage men and boys at the grassroots level to change societal stereotypes and beliefs, one boy at a time.





Gender Mobile Initiative partners with the University of Abuja for a Townhall forum.

The Gender Mobile Initiative team visited the University of Abuja, Gwagwalada, to increase reportage, hold perpetrators accountable, and improve institutional accountability in tertiary institutions. They briefed the University Management on their ongoing activities, and together they agreed to hold a Town-hall forum to discuss gender equity, sexual harassment, and discrimination. The team also met with the Student Union Government representatives, who pledged their support for the initiative. The Center for Gender expressed excitement about the partnership and the opportunity to engage with students and stakeholders. The visit promises to be a catalyst for positive change in the university community.

Homsen Women Farmers Extend International Women's Day Celebration with Nba'al Traditional Council.

Homsen Women Farmers joined forces with 'Magajiya Mat Nagiya', their prospective Women Representative in the Nba'al Traditional Council, to extend their International Women's Day celebration on March 31st, 2023. The event was attended by His Royal Highness Miskoom Yenyil (Noebang Nbaal) of Shendam LGA in Plateau state, who pledged maximum cooperation towards the completion of the "Mu ma a yi damu" project. The event highlights the Homsen Women Farmers' dedication to promoting women's rights and economic empowerment.





Cognito and NINE - Capturing Grantee Innovations.

Cognito & NINE visited four grantee organizations in fulfilment of the Innovate and Test approach under the Voice Program, with the aim of capturing their learnings in the form of audio-visual materials. The organizations visited were CARE, CODE, FOSER, and YIAGA Africa, all of which have implemented projects that have made significant changes in Nigerian communities. CARE's "Project Accessible Aviation" made Nigerian airports more accommodating for PWDs, CODE's "Project SABI" focused on increasing awareness and understanding of reproductive health and gender-based violence, FOSER's "Know Your Rights" aimed to curb police brutality and educate communities on their basic human rights, and YIAGA Africa's "Run to Win" encouraged more young people to run for office. Cognito & Nine plans to release documentaries featuring these materials in the near future.
